Our Presenter: Cindy Martin is a Certified Training Partner of the Karen Pryor Academy for Animal Training and Behavior. She serves as a coach for Alexandra Kurland's The Click That Teaches online course about clicker training horses. Cindy holds memberships in the International Association of Animal Behavior Consultants, the Pet Professional Guild, the Association of Professional Dog Trainers and the Behavior Education Network. Cindy has participated in a variety of Continuing Education events, including “Living and Learning with Animals,” from Behaviorworks.org; The Art & Science of Animal Training; The Progressive Equine Behavior Forum and Clicker Expo. She completed online courses in animal nutrition by Eleanor Kellon, DVM: NRC Plus; Cushings and Insulin Resistance; Nutrition as Therapy; Deworming short course; and Feeding Dogs and Cats. She is a graduate of the Whole Horse Hoof Care program, can evaluate hooves, trim and apply glue on shoes. She is particularly interested in Classical Dressage and helping horses find their own good balance, and helping owners develop willing, cooperative equine partners. Through her business, Mad Dog Ranch Training & Behavior, she provides behavior counseling and private training for people with horses and dogs. Her focus in dogs is resolving fear and aggression.



Seminar: In this seminar, presentations will focus on:

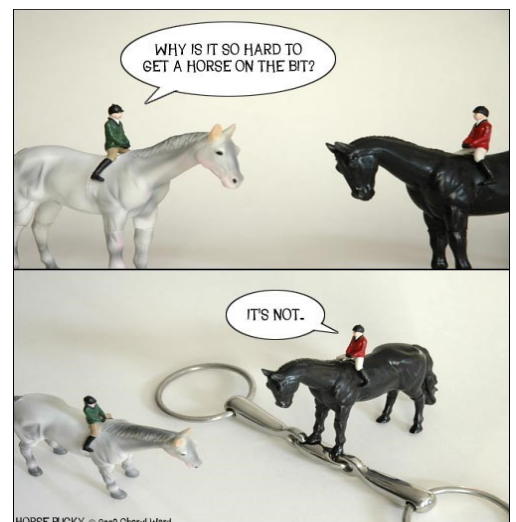
- The three levels of analyzing animal behavior: medical, ethological and behavioral.
- Understanding the Science behind training, behavior change and how animals learn: Operant and Respondent Learning, including Positive and Negative how to use each in a balanced manner to achieve desired results in training, husbandry and healthcare.
- How animals learn, and how you can adapt their behavior to optimize the well-being of the animal.
- How to set up optimal conditions for animals to learn. Matching training techniques with the task being taught.
- Ensuring only desired behaviors are taught. How to think about the future of the behavior and ensure the well-being of the animal.
- How to understand the deeper details of behavior science.
